Project Update

BluEarth Renewables is committed to engaging stakeholders on our projects and working together with honest and transparent communications. We are sending this newsletter to provide a community update on the development of our Wheatcrest Solar Project located near the community of Enchant within the Municipal District of Taber, Alberta.

Since our last community newsletter in November 2021, development work on the Wheatcrest Solar Project has continued. We are excited to share that we have signed a power purchase agreement (PPA) for the Project with the City of Edmonton. With this PPA, the City will purchase a portion of the power generated from the Project to support their goal of being 100% renewably powered.

Our team is continuing to advance engineering work and optimize the layout for this Project, and we anticipate construction will begin this fall, and the Project will be operational in fall 2023. In addition, the Project's nameplate capacity has been reduced from 60 MW to 50 MW due to interconnection constraints, and the Project layout has been modified to reflect this change.

Last year, we applied for a development permit with the MD of Taber, and approval was received in March 2022. We also received approval from the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) in July 2021 to build and operate the Project, and the Project has been progressing through the interconnection process. As the final step in the interconnection process, we anticipate the Facility Application for the Project transmission line will be filed with the AUC in July 2022.

As we prepare to begin construction on the Wheatcrest Solar Project, we will be hosting a community open house for the public to learn more about the Project and meet our team. We invite you to join us!

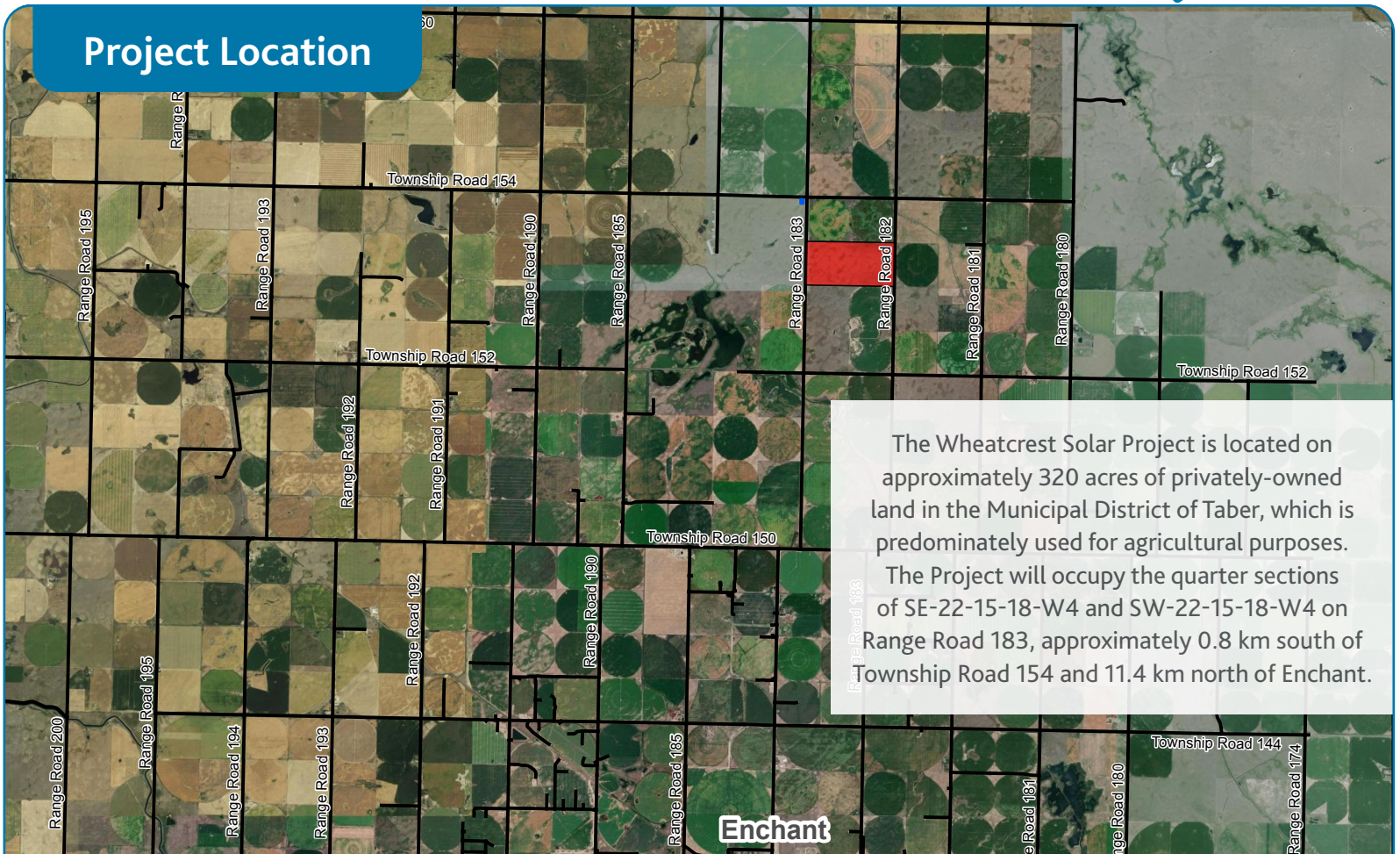

Project Location



The Wheatcrest Solar Project is located on approximately 320 acres of privately-owned land in the Municipal District of Taber, which is predominately used for agricultural purposes. The Project will occupy the quarter sections of SE-22-15-18-W4 and SW-22-15-18-W4 on Range Road 183, approximately 0.8 km south of Township Road 154 and 11.4 km north of Enchant.
