BluEarth Renewables is committed to engaging stakeholders and community members in the decision-making process for our projects and working together with honest and transparent communications. We are sending this newsletter to provide a community update on the development of our Outlaw Trail Wind Project (the "Project") located in the Rural Municipalities of Happy Valley No. 10 and Hart Butte No. 11, approximately 5 km north of Big Beaver and 20 km east of Coronach.

Project Update

In September 2023, SaskPower released a request for proposals for the development, construction, and operation of two 200 MW wind generation facilities in Saskatchewan's South-Central region (the "RFP"). BluEarth intends to submit the Outlaw Trail Wind Project into this RFP, which if selected, would sell energy produced to SaskPower under a power purchase agreement with a fixed term of 30 years. The Project is expected to be completed before November 2027, if awarded a power purchase agreement in June 2024.



Since our last formal community outreach in 2020, we have continued development work, including feasibility, engineering, environmental, and technical studies to inform the overall design of the Project. On March 18, 2022, the Saskatchewan Ministry of Environment issued a Ministerial Approval for the development of the Project, a major milestone in Saskatchewan's environmental permitting process. Community Benefits

We are committed to giving back to the communities where we live, work, and operate, and your feedback is critical in determining a 30-year benefits program for the Project that is most meaningful to the community.

Community benefits could include initiatives such as: scholarships / bursaries, support for environmental stewardship programs, local hospitals, recreational area improvements, education programs, social supports, etc. Feedback can be provided through the survey link on the reverse side.

In addition to an ongoing community benefits program, the Project will provide additional benefits including:

- Full-time local employment of up to seven positions to support the operations and maintenance of the Project;
- Increased economic activity in the region during construction including local hospitality, lodging, and food and beverage services. We anticipate up to 175 full-time jobs during peak construction (approximately 225,000 person hours);
- Selection of local suppliers will be given preference during construction and operations, where possible; and
- Contribution of over \$2 million in average annual property tax revenue for the RMs over the 30-year Project life.
